Grey Road 40 Reconstruction and Widening

Work is scheduled from early May to late September from Grey Road 13 in the Town of The Blue Mountains to Grey Road 7 in the Municipality of Grey Highlands. The project will include culvert and guiderail replacement, and widening to include paved shoulders. This project will include alternating lane closures at times.

Grey County is hosting a come-and-go public information session regarding this project on Thursday, April 18 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Marsh Street Centre in Clarksburg. All those interested are invited to attend.

Mayor Andrea Matrosovs of The Blue Mountains will be among 100 mayors around the world to receive funding through Bloomberg Philanthropies' first-ever Youth Climate Action Fund. The fund aims to turbocharge youth-led action on climate change by giving mayors funding and technical support to award to leading young changemakers in their municipalities.

BLOOMBERG PHILANTHROPIES LAUNCHES YOUTH ACTION FUND TO ACTIVATE TENS OF THOUSANDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE IN DRIVING CLIMATE SOLUTIONS IN 100 CITIES ACROSS THE GLOBE

100 cities will receive funding and technical assistance to spur a groundswell of youth-driven climate activity

New York, New York – (April 10, 2024) – With 84 percent of youth around the world reporting that they are worried climate change threatens people and the planet, Bloomberg Philanthropies today launched the Youth Climate Action Fund which will provide technical assistance and funding for 100 mayors to activate tens of thousands of young people ages of 15 – 24 years to design, produce, and govern urgent climate solutions in their cities. The cities in the Fund span 38 countries across six continents, representing over 62 million residents.

Each city will receive \$50,000 to distribute as microgrants to fund a groundswell of youth-led climate initiatives that meet local contexts and objectives. From mobilizing tree-planting or public education campaigns to launching recycling or waste reduction initiatives to participating in mitigation planning or preparedness programs, efforts stemming from the new Youth Climate Action Fund will advance critical community goals such as meeting decarbonization commitments or reducing consumption-based emissions. Cities that respond to the urgency of the moment and commit the initial \$50,000 within six months will receive an additional \$100,000 to support more youth-driven projects over the course of one year.

"Climate change is an all-hands-on-deck challenge, and it's critical that young people – who have the most at stake – help lead the way," said Michael R. Bloomberg, UN Special Envoy on Climate Ambition and Solutions and 108th mayor of New York City. "This new fund will help mayors mobilize and empower tomorrow's leaders to take action today."

The climate crisis poses an existential threat to communities, and mayors are the first and last mile of response: tackling emergencies and trialing interventions from the frontlines. Over the last decade, local governments have played a critical role in climate mitigation and adaptation – and this is only expected to grow in the coming *continued on page 2*

decade. Many cities are reducing per capita emissions faster than their national governments.

However, with more than 60 percent of young people saying that government is not doing enough to avoid climate catastrophe or taking their concerns seriously enough, few city halls have the organizational capacity, capabilities, and confidence to unleash youth energy on solution-building. Kickstarted at the Bloomberg Philanthropies Mayors Innovation Studio at COP28, as a part of the Local Climate Action Summit, the Bloomberg Philanthropies Youth Climate Action Fund will provide the cities with the tools, techniques, and supports to leverage innovation approaches that invite and foster robust youth collaboration in climate problem-solving and policymaking. The program will be delivered by United Cities and Local Governments in partnership with the Bloomberg Center for Public Innovation at Johns Hopkins University. C40 Cities and the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy will collaborate as learning partners.

"United Cities and Local Governments is thrilled to join Bloomberg Philanthropies in celebrating the cities around the world that are joining the Youth Climate Action Fund—and partnering with the organization on this work," said Emilia Sáiz, Secretary General for United Cities and Local Governments. "Youth today are the guardians of our future, and in bringing them together with local governments through this groundbreaking initiative, we will see cities reach newfound progress in shaping more resilient and regenerative communities that can act on the climate emergency in entirely new ways."

"In order for cities to catalyze ever broadening, ever more ambitious efforts, they'll need to continue to shift away from traditional, topdown models to those that solicit ideas and crowd in energy from across the community, including and especially from young people who are so vested in solving the climate crisis," said James Anderson, who leads the Government Innovation program at Bloomberg Philanthropies. climate hackathons; youth-developed climate surveys and research; youth-informed clubs or curriculum; and youth-designed public art and awareness campaigns.

Youth-driven climate mitigation and adaptation projects, including: youth-led community gardening, tree planting, reforestation, and urban farming campaigns; youth-managed recycling and waste reduction programs; and youth-produced climate resilience workshops and disaster preparedness programs.

Co-governed youth climate action plans, including: partnerships between city leaders and youth groups to inform climate-related policy ideas, decisions, or actions or the formation of youth climate ambassadors or advisory boards.

Canadian Budget 2024

The Government of Canada's Budget 2024 will be tabled in the House of Commons by the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance on Tuesday, April 16, 2024.

In recent days, the Prime Minister announced new action in advance of Budget 2024 to ensure fairness for every generation. Budget 2024 will:

- Restore generational fairness for renters, particularly Millennials and Gen Z, by taking new action to protect renters' rights and unlock pathways for them to become homeowners.
- Save more young families money and help more moms return to their careers by building more affordable child care spaces and training more early childhood educators across Canada.
- Create a National School Food Program to provide meals to about 400,000 kids every year and help ensure every child has the best start in life, no matter their circumstances.
- Launch a new \$6 billion Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund to accelerate the construction or upgrade of essential infrastructure across the country and get more homes built for Canadians.
- Top-up the Apartment Construction Loan Program with \$15 billion, make new reforms so it is easier to access, and launch Canada Builds to call on all provinces and territories to join a Team Canada effort to build more homes, faster.

The new Canada Rental Protection Fund builds on other initiatives we have implemented to help maintain a resilient community housing sector and deliver below-market housing options in Canada, including:

The Affordable Housing Fund, a \$14+ billion initiative that supports the creation of affordable rental housing and the repair and renewal of existing housing. It is designed to attract partnerships and investments to develop projects that meet a broad spectrum of housing needs, from shelters to mixed-income and mixed-use rentals. As of December 31, 2023, the Fund has committed \$8+ billion to repair or renew over 150,000 homes and support the construction of more than 32,000 new homes.

The Rapid Housing Initiative, a \$4 billion fund that is fasttracking the construction of 15,500 new affordable homes for people experiencing homelessness or in severe housing need by 2026. The Rapid Housing Initiative also supports the acquisition of existing buildings for the purpose of rehabilitation or conversion to permanent affordable housing units, focusing on the housing needs of the most vulnerable, including people experiencing or at risk of homelessness, women fleeing domestic violence, seniors, Indigenous Peoples, and persons with disabilities.

The Federal Community Housing Initiative, a \$600+ million initiative that provides funding to federally administered community housing providers to stabilize their operations, subsidize rents for tenants in need, and maintain the current federally administered community housing stock, which includes 55,000 households.

Canada's economic plan is to build more homes faster and to make housing more affordable. This plan also includes:

The Apartment Construction Loan Program, a \$40 billion initiative that will be topped up with an additional \$15 billion in Budget 2024 to boost the construction of new rental homes by providing low-cost financing to homebuilders. Since 2017, the Apartment Construction Loan Program has committed over \$18 billion in loans to support the creation of more than 48,000 new rental homes. With yesterday's announcement, the Apartment Construction Loan Program is now on track to help build over 131,000 new rental homes across Canada by 2031-32.

The Housing Accelerator Fund, a \$4 billion initiative that will be topped up with an additional \$400 million in Budget 2024 to encourage municipalities to incentivize building by making transformative changes, such as removing prohibitive zoning barriers. To date, the federal government has signed 179 Housing Accelerator Fund agreements which, combined, will fast-track an estimated total of over 750,000 housing units across the country over the next decade. www.placetocallhome.ca.

Notice of Public Information Centre Bay Street East Reconstruction

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise the public of an upcoming virtual Public Information Centre (PIC) that has been scheduled regarding the Bay Street East Reconstruction project. This PIC is being held to gather initial input on the project from stakeholders and residents. The meeting will include a public comment and question period. All those interested in the project are invited to attend. Pre-registration is required.

What is being proposed?

The Town of The Blue Mountains needs to install a secondary sanitary forcemain from the Mill Street Pumping Station to the Thornbury Wastewater Treatment Plant (TWWTP) to service growth in the west portion of the municipality. The secondary forcemain will begin at the Mill Street Sewage Pumping Station and follow Bay Street East to Grey Street, and then proceed south on Grey Street to the treatment plant.

The Town's Asset Management Plan indicates that the sanitary sewer and watermain on Bay Street is in poor to very poor condition and is approaching the end of its useful life. Considering that Bay Street will be significantly disturbed from Mill Street to Grey Street for the installation of the secondary forcemain, this provides a good opportunity to reconstruct the entire road to ensure that the watermain, sewers and stormwater systems are updated and adequate for the next 50-75 years. The project will also see the installation of a new outfall pipe on Grey Street from the TWWTP to Georgian Bay.

The Town hosted a Neighbourhood Meeting on Saturday, December 2 at Bayview Park. The Town's project team was able to illustrate some of the challenges they face based on existing conditions, and residents were able to share their concerns and thoughts on different elements of the project including active transportation options, impacts to trees, traffic calming measures, road alignments and drainage and stormwater management. The feedback gathered from the Neighbourhood Meeting, along with regulatory requirements, the Town's Official Plan, Transportation Master Plan and Engineering Standards has been used to inform the preliminary design alternatives and prepare for this first Public Information Centre.

Ontario Building More Inclusive Communities

Applications now open for 2024-25 Inclusive Community Grants

TORONTO — The Ontario government is investing \$750,000 this year to help communities across the province become more agefriendly and accessible for people of all ages and abilities.

Applications for the 2024-25 cycle of Inclusive Community Grants are open. These grants provide municipalities, non-profit organizations, and Indigenous communities with up to \$60,000 for local projects that will help older adults and people with disabilities participate in community life.

"We know that everyone benefits from inclusive communities that support independent, active living and help reduce social isolation by removing barriers," said Raymond Cho, Minister for Seniors and Accessibility. "That's why I'm proud to announce the launch of the latest round of funding for Inclusive Community Grants, which will help enable older adults and people with disabilities to contribute to all aspects of community life."

Since the Inclusive Community Grants Program was created in 2020, the Ontario government has provided up to \$4.5 million to support 87 projects in communities across Ontario. Last year, the funding supported important projects such as:

- Haliburton's Abbey Gardens Community Trust to establish an accessible recreational trail system for people of all abilities.
- The City of Kenora's third phase of their Norman Park Accessibility project that will build the only fully accessible park with lake/ beach access in the area.
- Madawaska Valley to install new fully accessible, wheelchairfriendly, all-weather picnic tables in seven municipal parks.
- Sault Ste. Marie's Pointe Des Chenes Day Park and Beach to update
