BVO Champions the Circular Economy

With Earth Day arriving on April 22 and climate change in sharp focus more than ever, how we deal with the products we buy has come under scrutiny. What happens to the way we use (and dispose of) items like clothing, toys, housewares, electronics and other items? It is these items that the "Circular Economy" aims to tackle. The following definition probably describes it best:

The circular economy is a production and consumption model that ensures sustainable growth over time by driving the optimization resources, reducing the consumption of raw materials, and recovering waste by recycling or giving it a second life as a new product. In the circular economy, everything has value and everything is used, so that waste becomes a new



resource, and the balance between progress and sustainability is maintained.

While the concept is relatively new, Beaver Valley Outreach has been championing the circular economy for decades. BVO is a local, grass-roots organization made up of volunteers and a small staff team that operates programs and services to further the social, economic and environmental well-being of our community. Today, BVO's well-known "Treasure Shop", operated by dedicated volunteers and a few staff, sells gently-used clothing, household items, toys, books and other items donated by the community via on-site donation bins, at low cost to eager buyers. Proceeds go towards supporting local children, families, seniors and youth.

In 2023, BVO diverted an astounding 425,000+ lbs of donated materials and textiles from our local landfill. "Most donated items are sold in our Treasure Shop or used in our programs and services, which includes giving items directly to families "BVO Executive Director Carolyn Letourneau explains. "We also divert items in other ways. Depending on their purpose, some items are 'triaged' beyond the Treasure Shop and go to designated organizations like Habitat for Humanity, Treasure Tails and textile recycling via Diabetes Canada, for which we are reimbursed," Books are recycled, as are beer, wine and spirit bottles and cans via Bottles for BVO, a program that encourages people to donate their empties to BVO.

"BVO has long been an active, local proponent of the circular economy. It's our way of helping to make our planet more sustainable," Carolyn Letourneau observes. "Through our efforts, some products get a third, or even a fourth life. It's a local activity that benefits the local economy, the local environment, and local people. And, it's gentle on the pocketbook!

Public Health raising awareness of environmental issues this Earth Day



In recognition of Earth Day, which takes place annually on April 22, Grey Bruce Public **Public Health** Health (GBPH) is helping to raise awareness of environmental issues as well as the importance of actions to advance climate change mitigation and adaptation.

The global theme of Earth Day 2024 is Planet vs. Plastics, which aims to shine a light on the health and environmental impacts of plastic pollution.

To coincide with this theme, GBPH is drawing attention to the impact plastic and electronic waste from vaping devices (e-cigarettes) has on our waterways, air, and local and global environments.

"For decades, cigarette butts have been the single most-littered item found during beach and shoreline cleanups. While cigarettes and other commercial tobacco products continue to cause great harm to human health and the environment, there is growing concern about how waste from vapes and electronic cigarettes is affecting our planet," says Jason Weppler, Program Manager of Health Promotion at GBPH.

Reports have shown that 90 million vaping pods were sold in Canada in 2019. The availability of disposable vaping devices has increased since 2019 with disposables being the fastest-growing category of vapes, according to Physicians for a Smoke-Free Canada.

Once used, vapes are considered hazardous waste as they contain a lithium battery, circuit board, heavy metals, and, of course, nicotine or cannabis. With few facilities or services available to accept and recycle used vapes, people who vape are left with limited options for disposing of the products in an environmentally safe way. It is likely many vapes are ending up in landfills along with many other discarded plastics.

"Youth, in particular, are concerned about climate change and the environment. Results from the 2019 Ontario Student Drug Use and Health Survey showed 37% of students surveyed are worried about climate change and another 50% feel depressed about the future because of climate change. While the future may be worrisome, we can make a difference by working together toward collective impact. For many youth, taking a stand against vaping for environmental reasons can be a way to feel empowered in a changing world," Weppler says.

To help raise awareness of environmental issues, Grey Bruce Public Health will have a booth at this year's Earth Day Celebration in downtown Owen Sound.

During the April 20 event, GBPH staff will be encouraging visitors to complete a survey, aimed at gathering information on which environmental issues are of greatest concern to the community.

Zoning By-law Amendment application with Townwide effects.

Council approved the application and passed By-law 2024-31 on April 15, 2024. The purpose of the amendment is to ensure conformity with the Planning Act, provide clarity around what constitutes an Additional Residential Unit, and encourage the construction of Additional Residential Units through increased flexibility.

The effect of the amendment is to permit a maximum of two Additional Residential Units on certain properties in the Town, to update associated definitions, and to modify various standards, including, but not limited to, setbacks, height, and floor area.

ADDITIONAL RESIDENTIAL UNIT (ARU) means a legally constructed permanent or semipermanent dwelling unit that can safely accommodate residents on a year-round basis.

ARUs are generally contained within a main building (including a single detached, semidetached or rowhouse dwelling), or within an accessory building (such as above a private garage). An ARU shall contain cooking, eating, living, sleeping, and sanitary facilities, be connected to adequate water and sanitary servicing, and meet all requirements of the Ontario Building Code. An ARU may also be known as an "additional dwelling unit", "accessory dwelling unit", "ADU", "accessory apartment", "secondary dwelling unit", or "secondary suite". An ARU may be considered as a garden suite where an approved temporary land-use by-law is in in effect but shall not mean or include a primary residential unit, a recreational trailer or vehicle, or a short-term accommodation.

PRIMARY RESIDENTIAL UNIT Means the primary dwelling unit in a single detached, semidetached or rowhouse dwelling. A primary residential unit shall not mean or include an additional residential unit.

Zoning By-law Amendment Approved for 178 Marsh Street, Clarksburg

Council receive Staff Report PDS.24.040, entitled "Recommendation Report – Follow-Up to the Public meeting – Zoning By-Law Amendment for 178 Marsh Street (Von Teichman)"

Council directed staff to work with the applicant to explore creative opportunities to accommodate the required 24 parking spots.

Council agreed to enact a By-law to re-zone the subject lands from the Village Commercial "C-1" Zone to the Village Commercial "C1-X-h21" Zone within Zoning By-law 2018-65, as amended, with the following exceptions:

- 1. A reduced exterior side yard setback of 1.5m, whereas a minimum of 4.5m is required;
- 2. A rear yard setback of 3.00m, whereas a minimum of 7.5m is required;
- 3. Permission to locate 2 dwelling units on the ground floor of a non-residential building in a commercial zone provided those units are maintained as dwelling units in perpetuity.

A 3-storey, 10 apt building with 2 commercial spaces is being proposed for the corner of Marsh and Clark Streets in Clarksburg.

Exploring a Regional Green Economy


