Winter Overnight Pilot Update

Beginning November 1st, 2023, and running until April 30th, 2024, Safe 'N Sound expanded its support to our

community's most vulnerable individuals through its new Winter Overnight Pilot Program. With the financial support of County of Grey and community members, this initiative has allowed Safe 'N Sound to operate 24/7, extending its critical services to those in need and offering a warm refuge during the coldest hours.

The impact of Safe'N Sound's expanded services is substantial. Over the first 10 weeks, over 100 individuals have spent the night with us. Daily, Safe 'N Sound serves an average of 70 community members who access supports such as laundry, showers, clothing, transitional housing, and harm reduction programs. Notably, the provision of meals, especially breakfast and snacks, plays a pivotal role in meeting the immediate needs of the community. The organization is proud to announce that it distributes approximately 900 meals each month, a feat made possible through the generosity of community donations.

"I am extremely proud of the entire Safe 'N Sound team. They have been working diligently to provide dignity and care towards those that need it the most," said Executive Director Annette Pedlar. "Without such a committed team, we know some participants might not have made it through the winter and additionally there would be increased cost and pressures on other valuable community services such as the emergency room."

Safe 'N Sound remains dedicated to fostering a resilient and compassionate community, and with the Winter Overnight Pilot Program, the organization is better equipped than ever to make a lasting impact on the lives of those facing adversity. To continue this valuable community service, Safe 'N Sound is calling on the public to help.

Ontario Helping Rural Communities Grow With More Jobs, Homes and Infrastructure

Toronto — The Ontario government announced the latest steps in its plan to invest in rural communities and municipalities at the annual Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA) conference, with measures that will help to strengthen rural economies, get more homes and housing-enabling infrastructure built and increase access to important local services in rural areas.

"Unlike previous governments, our government will never ignore the needs of rural Ontario," said Premier Doug Ford. "We're working shoulder-to-shoulder with our municipal partners to attract new investments and jobs, provide better services closer to home and build the homes and infrastructure rural communities need to grow and prosper."

Premier Ford announced new details regarding the expansion of Ontario's \$1.2 billion Building Faster Fund (BFF) to small, rural and northern municipalities that have not been assigned housing targets by the province. Ten per cent – or \$120 million – of the BFF will be reserved for these municipalities to help them build housingenabling infrastructure, with the province intending to distribute these funds through an application-based process that will prioritize projects that can get shovels in the ground faster. The province will continue to consult closely with rural municipalities to ensure this process effectively reflects their unique needs.

In the coming months, the province will also begin to roll out BFF funding for municipalities that have met or exceeded their assigned housing targets. Premier Ford announced that the province intends to direct any unspent BFF funds leftover from municipalities that have not met their housing targets into additional housing-enabling infrastructure investments that can be applied for by all municipalities, including those that have already received funding through the BFF. This will ensure all municipalities continue to receive the support they need to get homes built while also continuing to reward and incentivize municipalities that meet or exceed their housing targets.

"Our government is committed to do what it takes to build more homes as quickly as possible across this province," said Paul Calandra, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "Our goal is simple: To build more homes than we ever have before. We owe that to hardworking Ontarians, including the thousands of people who came here to make their dreams of home ownership a reality. We will continue to work closely with our small, rural and northern municipal partners to make sure that no part of Ontario is left behind."

Kinga Surma, Minister of Infrastructure, announced that municipalities will be able to apply for funding beginning January 29, 2024 through the Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund to support municipal water projects that will help unlock housing opportunities and further protect communities. Through this program, the government is providing \$200 million over three years to help municipalities repair, rehabilitate and expand critical drinking water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure.

"We have taken action to support municipalities through the Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund. Programs such as this are proof that our government is making targeted investments to build critical infrastructure in communities which will unlock housing and support our growing population," said Minister Surma. "We will continue to build a stronger and more prosperous Ontario now and

for generations to come."

The government is taking further action to support rural municipalities and drive economic growth and success in rural Ontario. Lisa Thompson, Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs announced the start of consultations to help develop a new Rural Economic Development Strategy. Rural municipalities and the public will have an opportunity to share ideas about how Ontario can improve economic opportunities, create jobs and support growth in rural and Indigenous communities across the province.

Minister Thompson also announced the opening of the 2024/25 Rural Economic Development (RED) Program applications. Municipalities, Indigenous communities and not-for-profit groups have until February 21, 2024 to apply for cost-share funding for projects that will drive economic growth.

Quick Facts

The Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund is an application-based program that will provide \$200 million over three years for the repair, rehabilitation and expansion of core water infrastructure to protect communities and enable new housing development.

The Building Faster Fund provides up to \$1.2 billion over three years to ensure municipalities have the resources needed to build more homes. The fund is designed to help municipalities pay for critical housing-enabling infrastructure needed to accommodate growth, such as site servicing and building new roads.

The Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund is providing \$500 million to 390 of Ontario's 444 municipalities in 2024. The funding is unconditional and can be used to support the local priorities and specific needs of each community.

Ontario increased its annual investment in the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund (OCIF) by \$1 billion over five years, starting in 2022. OCIF provides funding to help 425 small, rural and northern communities renew and rehabilitate roads, bridges, water and wastewater infrastructure.

The Ontario government is investing more than \$108 million to renew and expand Ornge air ambulance's fixed wing fleet so they can continue to provide Ontarians, especially those living in rural and remote communities, with consistent access to high-quality urgent care.

As of January 1, 2024, the province is providing stable, sustainable funding to local public health agencies by restoring the 2020 75/25 provincial base funding cost-share model. The province is also providing a one per cent increase in base funding per year, for three years beginning in 2024.

Groomed Winter Trails Now Open At Municipal Recreation Complex

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise residents that winter trails at the Municipal Recreation Complex and the Georgian Trail are now open for public use



and will be maintained throughout the winter season, weather permitting.

Municipal Recreation Complex

The groomed trails at the Recreation Complex are now open for public use from sunrise to sunset. The Town asks that members of the public maintain a one-way traffic flow to allow space for both crosscountry skiers and general usage. Please note that during the winter, the Recreation Complex is a paid parking location. Residents may display their 2023 Parking Passes until March 15, 2024, or register their licence plate online or at Town Hall to park for free. For more information regarding parking registration, visit the Town website. For more information on the trail loop, please view the trail map.



Georgian Trail

The Town will continue to groom the Georgian Trail throughout the winter season. The Georgian Trail is a multi-use trail for walking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, fat biking, and other eco-friendly activities. Due to limited space, there will not be set tracks for crosscountry skiing on the Georgian Trail.

Before You Go & Practicing Trail Etiquette

The Town would like to emphasize that motorized vehicles and gas-powered machines are not permitted on the Georgian Trail or at the Recreation Complex. In addition, all dogs must be leashed, and please remember to pick up after your pets. Please also respect the Town's natural areas by taking all garbage with you. When using the public trails, please share the trail and be respectful to those around you and remember to remove your skis or snowshoes when crossing a road.

New Resident Parking Pass Registration System Launched

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise residents that the resident parking pass program will be transitioned to a **new online registration** system for 2024.

The new system will allow residents to register vehicles directly through the Town website. Vehicle registration can also be completed in person at Town Hall Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.. *The traditional rearview mirror parking passes are no longer available and will not be mailed to residents.*

All residential property owners and residential tenants in the Town can register vehicles for free. Multiple vehicles, subject to proof of ownership, can be registered per resident. Registered vehicles can park for free at all Town-owned paid parking locations.

Photo identification, proof of residency and vehicle registration are required to register a vehicle, whether online or in person. Existing 2023 resident parking passes and vehicle registrations will remain valid until March 15, 2024. Vehicles not registered as of March 15, 2024, will be subject to a fine when parking in a paid parking lot location without paying. Residents must register their vehicles for parking on an annual basis.

Non-resident parking passes are available to residents of the Municipality of Meaford, Grey Highlands, Clearview Township and the Town of Collingwood for \$100.00 + HST.


What is being proposed?

Complete applications for a proposed Zoning By-law Amendment and Draft Plan of Vacant Land Condominium have been received by the Town and the County respectively. The purpose of the applications is to:

- re-zone the subject lands from the Development (D) Zone to Residential Type One (R1-1) and Open Space (OS) Zones of the Town of The Blue Mountains Zoning By-law 2018-65; and
- create a 22 residential unit draft plan of vacant land condominium.

The effect of the applications is to permit the development of the lands for 22 single detached residential dwelling units (3.71 HA), private street (0.6 HA) and open space (0.51 HA) where currently the subject site is a forested significant woodland occupied by a residential dwelling and accessory structures.

Volunteer Fair and Recognition Program

National Volunteer Week is celebrated annually during the third week of April and this year it will be observed from April 14 to April 20. This week-long celebration is about placing a spotlight on inspiring figures whose invaluable seeds of kindness through volunteering are bettering the community and our world in general.

This significant celebration which was established in 1974 provides the perfect opportunity to say thank you. It also challenges us to do better and look for ways to be active participants, joining hands to impact our local communities and calling for more support.




