One of the biggest concerns at this time of year, is making sure that we get our 2023 income tax filing organized. Filing on time (April 30, 2024) saves you a penalty for late filing and is also linked to other programs*

For seniors, there are special provincial and federal credits and benefits. This month, you can attend information sessions about all of these benefits at L. E. Shore Library.

Thursday, March 21st, **1 p.m.** – **3 p.m.**, Cindy Marlor from Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) will explain the federal tax credits for adults 65+ and the different ways to file your tax return.

Tuesday, March 26th, from 1 p.m. – 3 p.m., Jeremy Bertrand, Ontario's Ministry of Finance Seniors' expert, will talk about the provincial tax credits and benefits. That includes the Medical Expense & Senior's Care at Home Tax Credits.





The total of fire loss for the Town was at total of \$7,404,100 between 13 fire events.

The Fire Department administration team changed through 2023 with the Interim Deputy Chief position was filled on a permanent basis in the end of the 2nd quarter.

An RFP for replacement of selfcontained breathing apparatus (SCBA) was completed and the new SCBA's went into service at the end of quarter 4 of 2023. Council also approval the single

source report for firefighter bunker gear allowing the fire department to replace gear that was expiring. By using the same manufacturer this affords the department an opportunity to optimize our usage of the gear by mixing the sizes of coats and pants if needed while gear is within its service life.

Staff has received information on the anticipated delivery date of the replacement aerial apparatus for Firehall 2 in Craigleith for the end of quarter 3. This is a delay from our anticipated delivery date due to the industry seeing supply chain issues across many

manufacturers. Knowing this, the Fire Department will be taking a proactive approach and releasing an RFP in 2024 for the replacement of the 2006 rescue/pumper out of Firehall 1 in Thornbury.

Staff are also considering including the 2010 rescue/ pumper out of Firehall 2 in Craigleith as part of this RFP, as there may be scale of purchase savings with the benefit of having same apparatus within the fleet.

for commercial occupancies are ongoing. Staff are working with commercial building owners to ensure they are ready for their annual fire and life safety inspection(s).

Short Term Accommodation inspections for license renewals were done by Inspectors with no restrictions in 2023.

Training, the 2023 recruit class and the probationary firefighters continued with skills evaluations resulting with these firefighters responding to emergency callouts.

As Council is aware, the Province announced that by 2026 all firefighters within Ontario are required to be certified. A framework was released to help Municipalities work towards this goal, and our Training Officer has been auditing individual training records and working with our PPC firefighters to ensure we are compliant by the 2026 deadline.

The Emergency Management program undertook normal regulatory requirements 2023. The town fulfilled the fifteen (15) requirements of Regulation 380/04 (O Reg 380/04) has received Annual Report 2023 3 correspondent stating this.

The Municipal Town Emergency Control Group participated in a joint emergency exercise that included the County of Grey and other surrounding municipalities.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) for Drinking Water Storage and Supply Deficiencies in the Town's East Pressure Zones





The Town of The Blue Mountains has initiated a MCEA to select the preferred solution to address the Town's water storage needs and supply deficiencies in the Town's Eastern Pressure Zones.

Background: In 2019, the Town completed the Water Distribution System Master Plan to evaluate the Town's long-term water distribution and storage needs. As part of the 2019 Master Plan, potential near and long-term storage and supply deficiencies were identified in the Town's eastern pressure zones, which includes the settlement areas of Craigleith, Swiss Meadows, Osler Bluff and Castle Glen.

Preliminary Preferred Alternative: As part of this MCEA, the Town has developed a set of alternatives to address the identified water storage and supply deficiencies. Alternatives considered included increasing the capacity of the existing Thornbury Water Treatment Plant (WTP), building a new WTP, and increasing supply from the Town of Collingwood.

The preliminary preferred alternative identified through this MCEA is to build a new WTP and storage facility on Arrowhead Road near Highway 26.


