About the COP28 Local Climate Action Summit

The COP28 Local Climate Action Summit will be a first-of-its-kind gathering to recognize the critical role local leaders play in reducing emissions, addressing climate risk, and supercharging national efforts to move further and faster on climate progress. Hosted by the COP28 Presidency and Bloomberg Philanthropies, the Summit aims to bring together hundreds of national and subnational climate leaders to transform climate finance, enhance global action, fast-track the energy transition, and strengthen resilience and adaptation at the local level. This Summit is backed by the world-leading networks of local leaders as well as subnational partner organizations, including the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group, the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy, ICLEI - Local Governments for Sustainability, United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), US Conference of Mayors, the Under2 Coalition, UN-Habitat, and others. About the United Nations Climate Change Conference

The 2023 United Nations Climate Change Conference is organized and hosted annually by the United Nations. The conference brings together the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change parties to negotiate and agree to action on how to tackle climate change, limit emissions and halt global warming. Who is eligible to attend the conference?

The 2023 United Nations Climate Change Conference is expected to welcome over 70,000 delegates from around the world, including heads of state and world leaders, non-government organizations, companies, youth groups, and other stakeholders.

How long will the Mayor be in Dubai for?

Mayor Matrosovs will be flying out of Canada on Wednesday, November 29 and will be returning on Thursday, December 7.

Who is paying for the trip?

All expenses for Mayor Matrosovs to attend the conference and summit are being paid directly by C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group. There is no cost to the Town related to travel, accommodation or any other related expenses.

How was the Mayor invited to attend and who submitted the nomination?

Mayor Matrosovs was nominated to attend the conference by the organization 'ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability'. ICLEI nominated 40 members to the C40 Climate Leadership Group for consideration. Of the 40 members nominated, Mayor Matrosovs was selected and was offered an all- expenses paid trip to attend the conference and summit. The 40 members selected and nominated by ICLEI were based on demonstrated active engagement in Climate Action who could represent the voice of Canadian municipalities in the delegation.

ICLEI was aware of Mayor Matrosovs through her previous work by attending and participating in other events attended or hosted by ICLEI, including the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative continued on page 2

Events for Life Land Request

Recommendation for November 27th Council Meeting

That Council endorse the selected property fronting Peel Street North as a permanent Program Centre for the Events For Life Centre Inc. as requested through their August 14, 2023 deputation to Council and that Council direct staff to negotiate with Events for Life Centre Inc. regarding the gifting of land, the conditions of the land disposition, and future funding for the development of a new Events for Life Programming Centre as outlined in Staff report FAF.23.180.

Staff have met with members of the Events for Life Board of Directors and clarified the following property elements that are essential and/or preferred to determining potential locations for the new facility:

- Facility will consist of 4,000 square feet of program space;
- Property should be within walking distance from Thornbury and the core business area;
- Property to be from three (3) acres to a potential eight (8) acres;
- Construction should be able to begin within two (2) years. This new facility would be used as the center for Events for Life's daytime programming. The property would not be considered for any residential or housing agency for the participants of the program now or in the future.

A Municipal Capital Facility option is permitted under the Municipal Act and allows for the following:

- Municipal, County, and Education taxes would not be collected;
- No Development Charge Fees would be collected;
- Town would retain ownership of the land and Events for Life would own and operate the facility; and if Events for Life ceased operations, the Town would assume ownership of the building.

What is ICLEI?

ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability is a global network of more than 2500 local and regional governments committed to sustainable urban development.

ICLEI is an association governed by its members and the elected ICLEI Regional (RexComs) and Global Executive Committees (GexCom). RexCom elections are held all nine ICLEI regions every three years. CLEI regions generally represent global geographical areas and regions include multiple countries. Following regional elections, each RexCom nominates one representative for the GexCom regional seat. The single ICLEI Global Executive Committee represents ICLEI Members on the global level.

Is the Town a member of ICLEI?

Yes, the Town has been a member of ICLEI Canada since 2009. The Town pays an annual membership cost of \$450.00 Euros (approximately \$672.00 CAD).

Why is the Town a member of ICLEI and what has the involvement been to date?

The Town joined ICLEI in 2009. The decision to join was based on ICLEI's national and international connections to bring global issues to small and local municipalities worldwide and to support small and local municipalities in reaching global opportunities for learning and collaboration. Locally, ICLEI developed Grey County's Climate Change Action Plan and assists the Town and other Grey municipalities with GhG mitigation and adaptation planning. In addition, the Towns Manager of Sustainability and Solid Waste, Jeff Fletcher, has actively participated with ICLEI Canada and is a current member of the ICLEI RexCom Canada Board of Directors.

What is C40 Climate Leadership Group and why would they pay for the Mayor to attend?

As provided on their website, C40 Climate Leadership Group is a global network of nearly 100 mayors of the world's leading cities that are united in action to confront the climate crisis. C40's diplomacy and advocacy work supports mayors and cities to engage in global, regional and national political discussions with the aim of enhancing their climate leadership, championing ambitious and equitable climate action and removing barriers to city-level action - all in the spirit of working towards a Global Green New Deal.

What does the Mayor hope to accomplish by attending the conference?

Mayor Matrosovs is eager to participate in the opportunity to provide municipal-level input into national and international policy and agreements. This is in support of the Town's declared Climate Change Emergency, which focused on enhanced and accelerated action on the Town's commitment to protecting the community, economy, and ecosystems from the impacts of climate change. In addition, the Town's Integrated Community Sustainability Plan, adopted in 2022, includes various actions related to climate solutions, collaboration and taking action to address climate change, all of which support the Town's involvement and partnership with ICLEI and the Mayor's attendance at the conference and summit.

The Grey County Early Learning Hub is celebrating one year supporting licensed child care providers in the region. Located at the Sydenham Campus in Owen Sound, the Early Learning Hub offers many resources including a lending library and professional learning opportunities to support



the ongoing professional development of early childhood educators in the community. The Early Learning Hub opened its doors on November 15, 2022.


Free memberships in the learning hub are available to those working in licensed home or centre-based child care, EarlyON Child & Family Centres, special needs resourcing services and authorized recreation programs within Grey County. Student membership is also available to early childhood education students residing in Grey County or attending Georgian College in Owen Sound.

Once enrolled, Early Learning Hub members have access to the lending library which includes toys, children's books and resource materials that can be used within their programs, free of charge. Members also have access to attend professional learning events, gather ideas from other members and Grey County staff are on site to help brainstorm, problem solve and provide suggestions of materials that may work for them based on children's interests.

Grey County also offers support to those considering beginning a career in early childhood education. Anyone interested in becoming an early childhood educator or offering licensed childcare can learn more about the rewarding career by visiting www.grey.ca/beanece.



Ontario Funds Innovative Modular Homes in Scarborough

Associate Minister of Housing Rob Flack announced that the Ontario government is providing approximately \$2 million in annual operating funding for a five-storey modular housing building containing 57 units that are prioritized for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.


Located at 39 Dundalk Drive in Scarborough, the building is part of the City of Toronto's **Modular Housing Initiative**, an innovative program which is increasing the supply of affordable housing across the city. All units in the building will be fully furnished and include a kitchen and bathroom. Twenty of the homes are barrier-free. Residents will begin moving into their new modular homes at the end of November.

The funding announced today is part of the province's Homelessness Prevention Program (HPP). The Ontario government is investing an additional \$202 million each year in homelessness prevention programs – the Homelessness Prevention Program and Indigenous Supportive Housing Program – bringing Ontario's total yearly investment to close to \$700 million.

"Homes First is excited to have been chosen as the operator of the new program located at 39 Dundalk, which adds 57 greatly needed units of supportive housing into the system. Individuals who were formerly experiencing homelessness will now have a home and access to 24-hour staff, specialized case managers available throughout the week, along with an on-site cook and full meal program." – Patricia Mueller, CEO, Homes First Society

Through HPP, service managers have the flexibility to allocate provincial funding to programs and services that address and prevent homelessness in their communities, such as rent supplements, homeless shelters, and supportive housing including capital projects.

In September, the provincial government announced an additional \$42 million in funding through the Canada-Ontario Housing Benefit to help the City of Toronto and other impacted municipalities across the province support asylum claimants and other at-risk populations in need of housing.

The Modular Housing Initiative is an innovative and costeffective way to build small-scale infill housing while providing a rapid, dignified response to connect people experiencing homelessness with homes and appropriate supports to help them achieve housing stability.

Modular housing, which is essentially prefabricated housing, is built off-site in a factory and transported to the site for assembly.

The building materials and colour palette proposed aim to help the building fit-in to the local context. The neutral colour palette, mix of textures, architectural features and use of wood on the exterior all help to create a building that is more refined and one that will stand the test of time.



Along with the modular housing building, the project includes a detailed landscape design with the goal of helping the project fit in with the area through extensive plantings of trees and shrubs, as well as protecting privacy for adjacent properties.

This three-storey rental apartment building has 56 studio apartments, common rooms, a dining room, program space and administrative offices and is designed to support people who are exiting homelessness

by providing affordable homes with support services. The building was created using innovative modular construction.

11 Macey Ave. opened on December 19, 2020, approximately eight months after being approved by City Council.
