If you misplace or do not receive a bag in the mail, you may also pick a bag up from Town Hall or the Landfill, or use a small, under 1 litre, clear zip-lock bag. Place your dead household batteries inside the bag and place it out for collection on your scheduled blue box collection day between Sept. 4-29.

Canadian Stand Up Paddleboard Champion



Tim Oliver, of Thornbury-Clarksburg, recently competed in and won the 2023 Canadian Stand Up Paddleboard (SUP) Championships in Collingwood, on Aug 12 and 13. Tim won the technical (short, looped course with many turns) and long distance race events, completing the 22 km distance race (Thornbury harbour to Collingwood harbour) in 2 hours, beating the second place paddler by 7 minutes.

Tim's success in Collingwood now makes him eligible to compete for Canada in the International Canoe Federation SUP World Championships in Pattaya, Thailand November 15-19. He will continue training throughout the Fall in hopes of being able to make the trip to Thailand. Unfortunately in the sport of SUP in Canada, athletes receive very little financial or logistical support from their national organization. Tim will need financial assistance to help cover the costs associated with travelling to and competing in the World Championships. A"GoFundMe" campaign has been created to allow friends and supporters near and far and local businesses within Southern Georgian Bay to extend their support in whatever way they can and wish to do.

Community Safety and Well-Being Plan Launches New Website cswbp.brucecounty.on.ca

The Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services has been working with multi-sectoral government partners and local community and policing partners to develop the Provincial Approach to Community Safety and Well-Being.

This work began in 2009 with a partnership between the Ministry and the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP) – together, these two groups initiated the development of a provincial response to crime and victimization.

This collaboration has culminated in both resources and legislation intended to support all communities across Ontario to develop their

Book Your Fall Cleanup before September 21st and receive a 15% discount own Community Safety and Well-Being Plans. **Municipalities MUST have a CSWBP – It's the Law.** New legislative amendments outlined under part XI, Section 143 of the current

Police Services Act (1990) mandates every municipal council to prepare and adopt a Community Safety and Well-Being Plan (CSWBP).

Municipalities have the discretion and flexibility to develop joint plans with surrounding municipalities or First Nation communities [s. 143(2)], although First Nation band councils are not required to engage in Community Safety and Well-Being Planning by leqislation.

This new legislative requirement came into force on January 1, 2019 [s. 143(2)]. Additional legislative requirements related to the CSWBP process include:

• Establishing a multi-sector advisory committee [s. 145(3)].

• Conducting consultations with the advisory committee, members of the public, including youth, members of racialized groups and of First



Nations, Métis and Inuit communities, as well as community organizations that represent these groups [s. 145(6)].

- Contents of the plan must include [s. 146]:
- Identifying priority risk factors (e.g. including, but not limited to, systemic discrimination and other social factors that contribute to crime, victimization, addiction, drug overdose and suicide);Identifying strategies to reduce the prioritized risk factors (e.g. new services, changing/coordinating existing services);
 Setting measurable outcomes.
- There are also requirements to publish a completed CSWBP online, in print for review by anyone who requests it, and in any other manner or form determined by the municipality – within 30 days after adopting the plan [s. 149(2), O. Reg. 527/18].
- Additional regulations prescribing requirements related to monitoring, evaluating, reporting on, and reviewing the CSWBP may be outlined at a later date.

What is Community Safety and Well-Being Planning (CSWBP) Bruce-Grey?

The goal of CSWBP is to achieve sustainable communities where everyone is safe, has a sense of belonging and opportunities to participate, and where individuals and families can meet their needs for education, healthcare, food, housing, income, and social and cultural expression.

The ongoing work of CSWBP is supported by an advisory committee representing over 70 partners from across Bruce and Grey who are working together to address crime prevention by investing in social development, prevention and risk intervention. This upstream preventative model focuses on protecting individuals against risk factors that may make them vulnerable to crime and victimization.

Expanding our collective understanding of crime and crime prevention is an important part of this work. This updated website will continue to provide resources that will help identify where we need to advocate, build capacity, or shift approaches to meet identified needs. A collaborative, preventative approach to crime prevention encourages everyone in our community to work together as we address issues that are important to the safety and well-being of the residents of Bruce and Grey.

How Can I Learn More?

One of the goals of CSWBP is ensuring a coordinated approach that leverages existing work and expertise, avoids duplication, and identifies opportunities for further action. As we work together to

With regard to proposed new Waste Management and Anti-Littering By-law and revisions to Administrative Monetary Penalties By-Laws.

What is being proposed?

The Blue Mountains Council will be holding a Public Meeting to receive comments on the proposed new Waste Management and Anti-Littering By-law and Amendments to the Administrative Monetary Penalties By-Law 2021-71 to reference the inclusion of Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs) in the proposed new Waste Management and Anti-littering By-law.

Council considered the following staff reports at the August 15, 2023 Committee of the Whole Meeting, and at the August 28, 2023 Council Meeting and provided direction to schedule Public Meetings on the proposed new Waste Management and Anti-littering By-law, a by-law that will rescind and replace existing by-laws that regulate waste collection, the landfill site, illegal waste dumping and littering:

CSOPS.23.046 Updated Waste Management and Anti-littering By-law

The By-laws to be replaced include:

- Littering of Private or Municipal Property By-law 1999-10;
- Solid Waste Collection By-law 2003-16; and
- Waste Diversion and Disposal By-law 2013-42

When will a decision be made?

It is important to note that a decision on the By-Law amendments has NOT been made at this point and will NOT be made at this Public Meeting. After reviewing the comments from the public, Staff will bring its recommendations to a future Committee of the Whole Meeting.

How can I make my views known about this proposal?

Any person or agency may provide comments on this matter in writing or verbally at the Public Meeting.

Comments at the Public Meeting assist the Town and Council in their decision-making process, so be sure to have your say!

How do I submit my comments?

Written Comments – You are encouraged to provide your comments or questions in writing using email or regular letter mail to the Town Clerk. Written comments received by **Friday September 15, 2023,** will be read by the Town Clerk at the Public Meeting for the benefit of everyone in attendance and will be included in the record of the Public Meeting.

Any submitted comments become part of the public record, including names and addresses.

Verbal Comments – This Public Meeting is a hybrid meeting, allowing the public to attend the meeting in person or virtually. Those that wish to make verbal comments virtually are required to pre-register with the Town Clerk, no later than five business days in advance of the Public Meeting, by Tuesday September 12, 2023.

Anyone wishing to provide their verbal comments in person at the Public Meeting, can attend the Town Hall, Council Chamber. Those providing their comments in person, are required to follow the Public Health Guidelines of the Town, as recommended by the Grey Bruce Health Unit.


