Grey County Long-Term Care Achieves Exemplary Standing From Accreditation Canada

Grey County long-term care services have been accredited with exemplary standing under the Qmentum Long Term Care accreditation program. Accreditation is voluntary and shows a commitment to providing safe, high-quality health services. The exemplary standing is the highest performance rating achievable through the program.

"I'm thrilled by the results of our accreditation review and am so proud of the residents, families and our dedicated team members whose hard work and commitment to resident-centred care made this achievement possible," said Jennifer Cornell, Grey County's Director of Long-Term Care and Senior Services. "Our team successfully met 658 of 659 accreditation standards. This is a remarkable achievement and is a testament to our commitment to quality and residentcentred care."

Grey County provides care through 316 bed licenses at Lee Manor in Owen Sound, Rockwood Terrace in Durham, and Grey Gables in Markdale.

Grey County has been working towards accreditation for over two years. Guided by the Long-Term Care Committee of Management, a plan was developed to update policies and practices to meet the many accreditation standards. Adjustments and enhancements were made and formal on-site review was conducted by Accreditation Canada from May 27-30. Grey County was assessed on six areas: governance and leadership, delivery of care models, emergency and disaster management, infection prevention and control, medication management, and residents' care experience.

Grey County long-term care adopted the 'Colour It' philosophy in 2014. Colour It is a promise of person-centred care that influences leadership, decision making and daily operations. The Colour It philosophy was highlighted in the accreditation review as an area of excellence. Other highlights of the review included resident and family engagement and involvement, compassionate and caring teams, committed leadership and collaboration with community partners.

The next on-site survey will be completed in four years.



Ontario Begins Automatic Licence Plate Renewals

The Ontario government is making life easier and more convenient for more than eight million drivers by becoming the first jurisdiction in North America to introduce automatic licence plate renewals. The change takes effect on July 1, 2024 and will save vehicle owners time, amounting to more than 900,000 hours every year.

"Under the leadership of Premier Ford, our government is making life more affordable and convenient for drivers," said Prabmeet Sarkaria, Minister of Transportation. "First, we eliminated licence plate sticker fees for passenger vehicles, saving drivers \$120 a year for every car they own. Now, we're saving drivers valuable time and making their lives easier by automatically renewing licence plates."

Licence plates for passenger vehicles, light-duty trucks, motorcycles and mopeds will renew automatically 90 days before expiry if the vehicle owner has valid insurance and no outstanding fines or tolls. If a licence plate cannot be renewed automatically, the vehicle owner will be notified and required to manually renew online or in person at ServiceOntario.

"The automatic licence plate renewal program stems from our government's unwavering commitment to deliver modern, seamless and time-saving services," said Todd McCarthy, Minister of Public and Business Service Delivery and Procurement. "By utilizing innovative technological solutions to streamline and improve government services, we are saving Ontarians precious time and money."

Until automatic licence plate renewals take effect, vehicle owners are required to manually renew their plates at no cost. Ontarians can check their licence plate status at ontario.ca/platerenewal.

Quick Facts

- Vehicle owners can ensure they do not miss digital notifications about issues related to automatic renewal by signing up for ServiceOntario reminders at https://reminders.ontario.ca/en or 1-800-387-3445.
- Vehicle owners who have signed up for ServiceOntario digital notifications will be sent notifications through email, text, or voicemail if their licence plates cannot be renewed at 90, 45, and 10 days before expiry, and again at 72 hours after expiry.
- Vehicle owners who have not signed up for digital notifications will be sent paper notifications by mail 90 days before expiry and 72 hours after expiry.
- In 2022, the Ontario government eliminated licence plate sticker fees and stickers for passenger vehicles, saving drivers up to \$120 a year for every car they own.
- The introduction of automatic licence plate renewals will not change the way the province, municipalities or the 407 ETR collect unpaid fines and tolls.
- In May 2024, the Get It Done Act received Royal Assent allowing for the transition to automatic renewal of licence plates.

Youth Climate Action Fund Now Accepting Applications

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise the public that the Youth Climate Action Fund is now accepting applications.

Youth-led climate initiatives are eligible for microgrants worth between \$1,500 and \$6,000. These projects can be implemented in any community within the traditional Territory of the Saugeen Ojibway Nation, which includes The Blue Mountains, Grey County, Southern Georgian Bay communities, Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation, Chippewas of Saugeen First Nation, Bruce County and other communities within this area.

Projects must be led and implemented by youth between the ages of 15 and 24 and support The Blue Mountains Future Story (the Town's sustainability plan) and/or Going Green in Grey (Grey County's Climate Action Plan). Proposals require the support of an eligible sponsoring organization to be considered. Organizations that are looking to participate or partner with a youth applicant are encouraged to refer to the Recipient Eligibility section of the Youth Climate Action Fund website.

Applications received by or before July 8, 2024, will be considered in a first round of evaluations. Applications received after July 8 will be considered in a second round that will close on August 12, 2024. Successful projects will be announced on August 26, 2024, with all projects to be completed by December 31, 2024.

The Town is also seeking applications, in the form of letters of interest, from members of the public to fill two vacancies on the Town of The Blue Mountains Youth Climate Action Fund Project Team. All applications should be submitted no later than Friday, June 21, 2024, at 1:00 p.m.

Tour the universe with a visit by the Ontario Planetarium, Monday, July 8 (L.E. Shore Library)


