Spring Into Moreston is at Grey Roots Museum and Moreston Heritage Village on Saturday, May 27, from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Grey Roots Museum & Archives is opening the gate to Moreston Heritage Village early for one day only on May 27th. It's a childfriendly, family event that also includes cuddly alpacas, model trains, and a food vendor.

This year's musical guest Mimi O'Bonsawin is a contemporary roots singer-songwriter from Northeastern Ontario with Franco-Ontarian and Abenaki roots. In 2019, Mimi's Connected was awarded Best Pop Album at the Indigenous Music Awards. Mimi will perform in the Village Bandstand at 12 p.m. and 2 p.m. with her partner Ryan Schurman on drums.

During the event, Canadian Raptor Conservancy will present a thrilling show featuring live Birds of Prey in flight. Showtimes are at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. in the village's amphitheatre. For live animals with a softer feel, the Alpaca Paddock features furry visitors from the Kickin' Back Alpaca Ranch. Guests can also join Moreston heritage interpreters planting vegetable seeds or spring-cleaning 19thcentury style, play some old-fashioned games, watch model trains in action, or make some simple handmade crafts. Plus, Anishinaabe Cultural Experiences will be on hand to offer authentic First Nations cultural perspectives and local maple syrup.



Updates to Paid Parking at Municipal Parking Lots for 2023

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise the public of updates to the paid parking program and fee structures for Municipal Parking Lots that were put into effect through the approval of the 2023 Town Budget.

PARKING PASSES

New for 2023, the Town is introducing Non-Resident Parking Passes. These passes are available to residents of the Municipality of Meaford, Grey Highlands, Clearview Township and the Town of Collingwood. The cost is \$100 +HST for each registered licence plate.

Parking for residents of the Town of The Blue Mountains remains free at all paid parking locations owned by the Town. Residents can either register their licence plate or display a printed resident pass in their rearview mirror. Town parking passes do not permit residents to park in privately owned paid parking lots. Printed resident passes are mailed to all taxpayers each spring. If you did not receive your parking pass, licence plate(s) can be registered by visiting Town Hall with photo identification, proof of residency and vehicle registration. **PARKING RATES**

As part of the approval of the 2023 Town Budget, Council conducted a review of parking rates for all municipal parking lots. The fees collected through the paid parking program are used to support ongoing maintenance of public spaces within the Town. The parking rate changes are listed below:

Downtown Thornbury Parking Lots

\$2.00 for the first hour and \$1.00 for each additional hour Includes the Arthur Street West Parking Lot

Rural Parking Lots

\$5.00 per hour (no daily maximum)

Includes Loree Forest and Heathcote Park

Waterfront Parking Lots

\$10.00 per hour (4 hour maximum)

Includes parking lots at Lora Bay Park, Little River Park, Thornbury Harbour, Bayview Park, Peasemarsh Park, Council Beach, Delphi Point Park and Northwinds Beach

Please note, Municipal Parking Passes do not permit parking in nonparking areas such as fire routes or accessible parking spaces. now. There has been a 43% increase of food bank visits in Ontario and 1 in 4 children are living in a food insecure home (Stats Can 2021).

Statistics Canada released the 2021 Canadian Income Survey results and updated the <u>Dimensions of Poverty Hub</u> with 2021 data. <u>www.statcan.gc.ca/en/topics-start/poverty</u>

The United Way of Bruce Grey works with community food programs to collect local data on Food Bruce Grey.

- Usage is not going down after the pandemic but increasing. Local food banks have reported the fastest growing population attending food banks are people who are employed.
- Meaford Food Bank reported, in the first quarter of 2023, food bank usage has increased by 47% compared to the same quarter last year. The pounds of food distributed has increased by 56%, and the number of first time users of the food bank has increased 200%.
 We know that food banks are a last resort. A recent TVO debate

spoke to our social safety net being outsourced to food banks.

We know that the Federal Funding for a National School Lunch Program was not in the 2023 budget. We know that schools are one conduit for food support to students and their families.

Across Canada, school food programs are speaking about their struggles to make ends meet right now. With the high price of food, it's costing some programs as much as 25% more than previous years to keep running. And they're seeing higher demand too – more children in need of a balanced meal.

We are concerned that this summer food banks and schools shall need to continue to support families. While support is provided for basic food needs, we need to advocate for "transformational change" that invests in income security such as a basic income.

INCOME SUPPORT

Basic Income: Bill S-233 has been sent to the Senate Standing Committee on National Finance. The next step is to encourage our elected representatives to follow the example of the Senate.

Grocery Rebate: a one-time payment was announced by the Federal government under Bill C-46, the Cost of Living Act. The rebate will be issued automatically by CRA to households with an income of \$38,000 or less, and individuals who make \$32,000 or less.

There is no need to apply for the grocery rebate. It will be delivered along with the July GST Credit payment. To receive the payment it is required that recipients have filed their 2021 tax return.

The rebate will be up to \$467 for eligible couples with two children, \$234 for single Canadians without children, and \$225 for seniors.

Museum Renovations Nearing Complete Blue Mountains Public Library Newsletter

It has been many months, but the historic Craigleith Station turned museum is nearly complete. In 2021 the Ontario Trillium Foundation awarded nearly a half million dollars from the Building Communities grant for capital enhancements to the Craigleith Heritage Depot.

This included a complete renovation of the shell of the 1880's building. The addition roof area, after blowing off in a summer storm in 2022 was replaced with a temporary fix and complete roofing was done in the Fall 2022 with a composite shake, intended to respect the original appearance of the roof. The original shakes on the turret were not touched.

In winter 2022-23 the rotten wood siding was removed from the building and was replaced with a two-tone composite wood. The two-tone green and cream has created much conversation in the community as this is a colour no one living has ever seen. As mentioned in reports and newsletters throughout 2022, the new look of our museum is the original colour pallet, harkening back to the original building when it was a Grand Trunk Railroad Station between 1880's to early 1920's. Though it was hard to confirm the colour from the 1800's black and white photos, our museum staff documented the original colour when the windows were removed for replacement and found the selected colours returned the building to its near perfect match more than 140 years after the Station opened. For those that remember the building being red; you are also correct. In the 1920's the Craigleith Station became part of the CN Railway, which is when the Grand Trunk colours were changed to the CN red. In 1968 the abandoned building was reopened as The Depot Fine

Dining Restaurant and again changed colour, becoming the maroon so many think of when reflecting on the buildings colours. Minor touch-ups are still to come when the weather improves with a cream architectural band scheduled to be painted on the turret and the lightning rods painting still yet to come.

The previously replaced windows and doors were also swapped out throughout the building, leaving the original turret entry with the last original door and the house entry (shown in photo) with the replica door. Finally, the interior of the building has also had a lovely facelift, moving it from the avocado, rust, and harvest gold interior; to a crisp clean look which will celebrate the exhibits.

Staff are now busy pulling the interior together and rebuilding our favourite exhibits and a number of new ones as well. We anticipate the museum being open for visits by the end of May and are now accepting visitors into the foyer where your library holds can be retrieved and washrooms are open.

While our staff are happy to discuss the process of the renovations to the museum, anyone looking for a more in-depth conversation should book a meeting with the CEO who is happy to further discuss the investments made into our community museum.

What is being proposed?

The Council of The Town of The Blue Mountains is considering options to updating the current Municipal Tree Preservation By-law 2010-68. Planning Staff began the process of reviewing By-law 2010-68 in 2019 with the overall goal to prevent premature tree cutting/removal on larger privately owned properties in advance of a development application. Since that time, staff have conducted an extensive review process that included different methods of engagement.

The draft by-law presented to Council in September 2022 applied to properties that are 0.5ha or larger which are located within the Settlement Area boundary of the Town. In October 2022, the previous term of Council deferred a decision on the by-law due to the municipal election occurring in November 2022.






