



## Grey Bruce Health Unit holding educational events in November to mark Fall Prevention Month

Falls are the leading cause of unintentional injuries in Grey-Bruce, with local hospitals reporting that about 8,100 emergency department visits and 817 hospitalizations are due to falls annually.

Grey-Bruce has the highest age-standardized rate of emergency department visits due to falls among all public health units in Ontario at nearly double the provincial rate. Falls occur across the lifespan and the rate of emergency department visits in Grey-Bruce attributed to falls is well above the provincial average in all age categories.

Falls can have serious consequences, especially for older adults, and multiple deaths each year are attributed to this cause locally.

“Residents aged 65 and older are at an increased risk of being injured because of a fall due to a variety of factors,” says Jason Weppler, Program Manager of Chronic Disease & Injury Prevention at the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

“However, it’s important to note that most falls can be prevented. The Grey Bruce Health Unit continues to work towards reducing the incidence and severity of falls and falls-related injuries among older adults through education and by promoting evidence-based fall prevention, intervention, and management initiatives.”

To mark Fall Prevention Month in November, the Grey Bruce Health Unit is holding two events – one in Owen Sound and another in Walkerton – to provide individuals and caregivers with important information aimed at preventing falls and assisting seniors to live independently in their homes for as long as possible.

**Sessions, entitled “Launching Fall Prevention Month: Seniors’ Morning for Keeping Independent,” will take place Nov. 1 from 9 a.m. to noon at the Grey Bruce Health Unit, 101 17th St. E. in Owen Sound, and Nov. 2 from 9 a.m. to noon at the Walkerton Legion, 505 Scott St. in Walkerton.**

Topics to be discussed include:

- preventing injuries from falls;
- home and community safety;
- fall risk; and
- medications, osteoporosis, and fractures.

There is no cost to attend these events, but people are asked to register by calling 519-376-9420 ext. 1410. Refreshments will be provided.

## Flu Shots Available Starting November 1st

With Health Canada approval of the Pfizer bivalent vaccine, everyone aged 12 and over is eligible to get a bivalent COVID-19 booster dose starting Monday, October 17 if they have completed their primary COVID-19 vaccine series. The Ontario government is reminding people to stay up-to-date with their vaccines as we enter respiratory illness season. It is also important to get your annual flu shot. Starting November 1, flu shots will be available through your health care provider, public health unit and in participating pharmacies. ## The Bruce Grey Poverty Task Force recognizes the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty on October 17th

This year’s theme is Dignity for All in Practice. The pandemic has highlighted the long standing gender, racial and economic inequalities in our labour and housing markets; and these inequalities are deepening as we move into a recession.

1 in 5 Grey Bruce households are food insecure. 65% of households that experience food insecurity have jobs. Only 20% of households that experience food insecurity access food banks. Solutions are needed to respond to poverty in a dignified way.

We need income solutions to provide a universal guaranteed income for all people and pay a living wage. We need to have meaningful action to address the cost-of-living crisis that continues to fuel a housing crisis. Ensuring all Grey Bruce residents have access to the income needed to meet their basic needs, including food, will improve community wellbeing and reduce the strain put on our healthcare system, creating an investment in our community’s future.

We recognize the work of more than 52+ social service organizations, policy makers and community members who are part of the Bruce Grey Poverty Task Force. ## Community helps Grey County take first steps to naturalize Administration Building site

On Saturday, October 15, more than 50 community members joined Grey County and NeighbourWoods North in taking climate action with tree planting at the Grey County Administration Building in Owen Sound. The planting is



phase one of work to naturalize the property. Twenty young, native species of saplings were planted along with a mixture of shrubs and plants to support biodiversity and sequester carbon.

“Climate change impacts all of us, and Grey County’s climate change action plan, Going Green in Grey, is our strategy for reducing our emissions,” explained Grey County Warden Selwyn Hicks. “One of



the 21 actions of the plan is to plant 1 million trees by 2030 and 5 million by 2045. This initial planting may be small, but it symbolizes our much larger commitment, and we will be reminded of it every time we pass by these beautiful new gardens.”

These projects exemplify how the Town and community organizations can work in partnership to foster the social vibrancy and environmental sustainability of our community.

## Eugenia Falls Management Plan

**Saturday, November 5th, 10am-12pm**

The Grey Sauble Conservation Authority is in the process of developing a Management Plan for the Eugenia Falls Conservation Area and Arboretum. This Plan will guide the management of this property over the next 10 to 20 years.

### Why we need a Management Plan

Recreational tourism, particularly, is becoming increasingly more popular. Due, in part, to social media coverage, many locations within our region, including the Peninsula, are experiencing unprecedented numbers of visitors. The Eugenia Falls Conservation Area is located directly on the travel corridor from the GTA to the Bruce Peninsula. As interest in the Peninsula continues to grow, Eugenia Falls Conservation Area is expected to continue to experience ever increasing visitor traffic.



The Eugenia Falls property is also extremely popular with local citizens, who recognize the value of this unique local treasure.

This plan is required to address future public use demands and to enhanced environmental protection. Furthermore, it is necessary to prepare a comprehensive and integrated management plan for the property that can respond to the changes in the availability of public funds and evolving concepts in conservation and sustainability. The plan is intended to match Grey Sauble Conservation Authority's vision of a healthy watershed environment in balance with the needs of society.

### Public Consultation

Over the last couple of years Grey Sauble Conservation Authority has received feedback from the general public, neighbours and partners through an online survey, phone calls and emails. We have put together a first draft at a management plan for the property, which has been reviewed by the Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee is made up of members from the community, partner groups and different levels of government.

We are now hoping to gain feedback on the **FIRST DRAFT OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN** by the general public. Please join us on Saturday, November 5th from 10am to 12pm at the Flesherton Kinplex to hear more about the draft management plan and have your say!



### About The Foundation

The Meaford Hospital Foundation was established to raise, receive, and manage money for the purpose of purchasing capital equipment and building improvements at the Meaford Hospital. This funding role is critical to the hospital's viability since the government provides few funds for capital purchases. Funds are derived from a variety of sources including gifts from individuals, clubs, associations and businesses; bequests; memorials; mail campaign and investment interest. Funds are raised for equipment at The Meaford Hospital as well as regionally at our Owen Sound hospital.

## Individuals 12 and older can now receive bivalent COVID-19 booster in Grey-Bruce

The Grey Bruce Health Unit is pleased to announce that starting this week, eligible individuals 12 years of age and older can receive a booster dose of the Health Canada-approved Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent COVID-19 vaccine – developed to target the Omicron BA.4 and BA.5 subvariants – at Public Health and local GO-VAXX vaccine clinics.

Public Health is also working with community partners to make this bivalent booster available via primary care practitioners and area pharmacies.

The Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty vaccine is the second bivalent COVID-19 booster to be authorized by Health Canada. It's the first to be approved for children and youth aged 12 to 17. Health Canada has also authorized a Moderna Spikevax bivalent vaccine as a booster dose for individuals aged 18 and over.

"Staying up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccinations continues to be one of the most effective ways to protect individuals, their families, and communities from serious outcomes as a result of COVID-19, especially individuals aged 65 and over or those at high risk of severe illness," says Lindsay Johnston, Program Manager, Vaccine Preventable Diseases, at the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

"Having bivalent boosters available to residents in Grey-Bruce is good news as we head further into the fall respiratory season, as these vaccines are expected to trigger a strong immune response to the most dominant strains of COVID-19 now in circulation within our communities."

Health Canada's approval on Oct. 7, 2022, of the Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent vaccine as a booster dose for individuals aged 12 and older came after a thorough and independent scientific review of the evidence that determined the booster is both safe and effective

Following Health Canada's approval, the provincial government announced on Oct. 13, 2022, that all Ontarians aged 12 and over would be eligible to receive a bivalent booster starting Oct. 17, 2022, if they have completed their primary COVID-19 vaccine series.

The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) now recommends that Omicron-targeting vaccines be offered to individuals aged 12 to 64 as a booster dose. NACI also strongly recommends that all individuals 65 years of age and older and also individuals 12 years of age and older who are at increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19 should be offered a fall booster dose regardless of the number of booster doses previously received. An interval of six months is recommended between a previous COVID-19 vaccine or infection and a booster dose.

The provincial government says individuals at high risk of severe COVID-19 illness and seniors aged 65 and over are strongly advised to receive their booster dose three months after their last dose.

All Ontarians aged five and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 booster. Children aged five to 11 can receive a monovalent vaccine as their booster dose. Infants and children aged six months to five years are eligible for a primary vaccine series only.




