Water Tower Rehabilitation Project Update and Design Considerations

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise residents that CIMA Canada Inc. (CIMA+) has been retained to provide engineering services for the rehabilitation of the Victoria Street Water Tower.



Rehabilitation of the Victoria St. Water Tower was identified as a preferred alternative solution through the West Side Water Storage Environmental Assessment. The rehabilitation project will include full stripping of the existing coating from the exterior and interior of the structure, exterior and interior steel repairs, interior lining upgrades and exterior coating upgrades. The work is expected to extend the water tower's service lifespan by 18-25 years.

Through this project, an opportunity was identified for the Town to explore new design options for the water tower. Taking inspiration from the winding waters of the Beaver River, the rolling waves of Georgian Bay and the vast green space of the Niagara Escarpment and Beaver Valley, the Town has produced a number of potential coating and design options for consideration. These designs are scheduled to be presented through Staff Report FAF.22.163 to the Town's Committee of the Whole for consideration at their meeting on **November 1, 2022**.

Ontario Taking Bold Action to Build

More Homes - Next steps in province's plan will get 1.5 million homes built over the next 10 years.

The Ontario government has introduced the More Homes Built Faster Act, which takes bold action to advance the province's plan to address the housing crisis by building 1.5 million homes over the next 10 years. The proposals in the More Homes Built Faster Act would, **if passed**, ensure that cities, towns and rural communities grow with a mix of ownership and rental housing types that meet the needs of all Ontarians, from single family homes to townhomes and mid-rise apartments.

"For too many Ontarians, including young people, newcomers, and seniors, finding the right home is still too challenging. This is not just a big-city crisis: the housing supply shortage affects all Ontarians, including rural, urban and suburban, north and south, young and old," said Steve Clark, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "Our government is following through on our commitment to Ontarians by cutting delays and red tape to get more homes built faster."

The plan puts in place actions to support the development of "gentle density" – housing like triplexes or garden suites – that bridge the gap between single family homes and high-rise apartments. For example, it would remove exclusionary zoning, which allows for only one single detached home per lot. Instead, it would allow property owners to build three units (main residence, basement apartment and a garden suite) without lengthy approvals and development charges.

The plan, which contains around 50 actions, addresses the housing crisis by reducing government fees and fixing developmental approval delays that slow down housing construction and increase costs. Actions in the plan include:

- Creating a new attainable housing program to drive the development of housing. Sites across all regions of Ontario will be considered, including those in the north, central, east and southwest regions.
- Increasing the Non-Resident Speculation Tax rate from 20 per cent to 25 per cent to deter non-resident investors from speculating on the province's housing market and help make home ownership more attainable for Ontario residents.
- Freezing and reducing government charges to spur new home construction and reduce the costs of housing.
- Building more density near transit, unlocking innovative approaches to design and construction, and removing red tape to get shovels in the ground faster.
- Increasing consumer protection measures for home buyers and consulting on ways to help more renters become homeowners.

The government will also consult with the public, stakeholders and municipalities while engaging with Indigenous communities to review provincial housing and land use planning policies to find ways to remove more barriers to getting homes built.

"Ontario's housing supply crisis is a problem which has been decades in the making. It will take both short-term strategies and long-term commitment from all levels of government, the private sector and not-for-profits to drive change," said Michael Parsa, Associate Minister of Housing.

Ontario is expected to grow by more than two million people over the next 10 years, with approximately 70 per cent of this growth taking place in the Greater Golden Horseshoe Region.

Ontario's first housing plan, More Homes, More Choice was released in 2019. It was followed by More Homes for Everyone in spring 2022.

Ontario is seeing strong progress resulting from these plans, with annual housing starts well above average for the past 30 years. The government is committed to developing a new housing supply action plan for every year of its current mandate to continue delivering real, long-term housing solutions.

A Housing Supply Action Plan Implementation Team, made up of municipal leaders and industry experts, will provide advice on market housing initiatives.

Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA)

Program Repayment Deadlines Have Changed

The existing terms of CEBA loans require that the outstanding balance (other than the amount available to be forgiven) be repaid on or before December 31, 2022 in order to be eligible for partial loan forgiveness. The Government of Canada has announced the December 31, 2022 forgiveness repayment date will be extended to December 31, 2023 for eligible CEBA loan holders in good standing. Curator at the Craigleith Heritage Depot, Andrea Wilson


