



Youth Climate Action Fund Announces Eight Grant Recipients

The Town of The Blue Mountains is pleased to announce it is supporting eight initiatives through the Youth Climate Action Fund.

The Town of The Blue Mountains was one of 100 communities worldwide to receive \$50,000 USD to distribute as microgrants of \$1,500 to \$6,000 CAD to fund youth-led climate initiatives. Through the application process, the Town received and selected eight eligible submissions totalling \$44,275 dollars.

To be eligible, the projects are new initiatives that will be led and implemented by youth between the ages of 15 and 24 within the traditional territory of Saugeen Ojibway Nation. Eligible projects support the Town's climate change goals from either The Blue Mountains Future Story, the Town's sustainability plan, or Going Green in Grey, Grey County's Climate Action Plan. Each of the selected youth-led projects is supported by an eligible sponsoring organization and youth leaders will work to complete their projects by December 31, 2024.

"We have been pleased to receive and select eight excellent applications to help support youth-led climate education, research and action since we launched the program in early June," said Town of The Blue Mountains Mayor Andrea Matrosovs. "Youth have great ideas about making a difference but sometimes do not have the means to enact them. This is a project fund that allows us to support them and provide the funding for small projects with big impact. We look forward to supporting these young leaders as they work to implement their meaningful and creative projects."

Launch of Tourism Strategy and Community Open House

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to announce that work is underway to develop the Town's first formal Tourism and Marketing Strategy. This strategy will help guide and manage tourism within the community.

To support the project, the Town has engaged Bannikin, an external tourism research and strategy development consultant who will be responsible for guiding the development of the strategic framework and recommendations. The strategy will be co-developed with engagement from industry members and the local community.

Residents and industry members interested in tourism are invited to attend the first public engagement session scheduled for **Wednesday, September 25, 2024 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m** at Town Hall. This drop-in open house will provide an informal opportunity to learn more about the project and to share experiences with tourism, and vision for the future of tourism development, management, and marketing in the Town of The Blue Mountains.

The initiatives selected to receive funding are:

Aki Guardians: guided nature walks in The Blue Mountains featuring climate change-related education and involving youth participants in litter cleanup activities, supported by Bagida'waad Alliance

Envirothon Education: an Envirothon student group at St. Mary's High School in Owen Sound will identify and pursue climate change education opportunities through field trips and will share what they learn with other students

Remote sensing monitoring of inland lakes in Bruce Peninsula National Park: a Master's student working with the University of Guelph and Parks Canada will use water level loggers and satellite data to research the impacts of climate change on inland lakes, and will share information about the research design and preliminary results with other youth

Tiny Forest: a high school student supported by Beaver Valley Outreach and Climate Action Now Network will engage other youth in the design and planting of a tiny forest on a parcel of land in The Blue Mountains

Green Grey Blue Mini Series: two post-secondary students will film a series of short videos featuring local and regional climate change initiatives, stories and experiences to help foster a sense of environmental stewardship and community pride

Youth Climate, Sustainability and Engagement Summit: a post-secondary student will coordinate a year-end event that will bring youth together with organizations and businesses in the environmental and sustainability sector

Natural pigment markers R&D: a post-secondary student and recent graduate will investigate the possibility of using naturally sourced pigments and alternative casing solutions for a more sustainable marker.

Events for Life Education and Newsletters: participants and youth leaders with Events for Life will learn about climate change from local leaders, and will collaborate to document and share what they learn through monthly newsletters

Statement from the Chief Medical Officer of Health re-Rabies

Dr. Kieran Moore, Chief Medical Officer of Health, issued the following statement: "Brant County Health Unit has received laboratory confirmation of a human case of rabies in a resident of Brantford-Brant. The illness is suspected to have been acquired from direct contact with a bat in Ontario. To ensure privacy for the family, no further information about the individual will be released.

As a precaution, family members, health care providers and other close contacts are being assessed and offered post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), as needed.

Rabies is a viral infection that causes brain and spinal cord inflammation. It is typically spread to humans through direct contact with saliva of an infected animal, such as through a bite or scratch. In Canada, rabies infections are commonly found in bats, but skunk, fox, and raccoon rabies variants are also circulating in Ontario.

If anyone in Ontario has direct physical contact with a bat, even if there is no visible bite or scratch, or if they have been bitten or exposed to saliva or infectious tissues from another animal species, they should seek immediate medical attention. The health care provider, in consultation with the local public health unit, will assess the risk of rabies and may offer vaccines to prevent infection.

Immediate medical care following suspected rabies exposures is critical. Post-exposure medical care includes washing the area with soap and water as soon as possible, a dose of rabies immune globulin and a series of rabies vaccines which must be administered as soon as possible after exposure. This treatment is nearly 100 per cent effective when administered promptly.

Cases of human rabies are extremely rare due to effective public health prevention and control measures. This is the first domestically acquired case of human rabies in Ontario since 1967. In Canada, there have been only 26 other known cases of rabies in humans since reporting began in 1924."

Convenience Stores Across Ontario Can Now Sell Beer, Wine, Cider and Ready-to-Drink Beverages

All licensed convenience stores in Ontario can sell beer, cider, wine and ready-to-drink alcoholic beverages, marking the largest expansion of consumer choice and convenience in provincial alcohol sales since the end of prohibition almost 100 years ago. As of September 5th, 4,187 convenience stores across Ontario are licensed to sell alcoholic beverages, in addition to nearly 3,000 other licensed retail outlets as well as takeaway options from licensed bars and restaurants.

The government's phased expansion, which began earlier this year, is giving customers across Ontario more choice and convenience, supporting businesses and helping to promote Ontario-made beverage producers. By the end of October 2024, as part of the government's plan to expand alcohol sales, every eligible convenience, grocery and big-box grocery store in Ontario will be able to sell beer, cider, wine and ready-to-drink alcoholic beverages if they choose to do so.

The government is also permanently allowing the transfer of wine and spirits between locations with the same owner and/or affiliated licensees in order to help bars and restaurants effectively manage inventory, and is allowing licensed grocery and convenience stores to display alcoholic beverages in multiple areas of a store, while maintaining small-producer shelf space requirements as well as policies that will continue to ensure the safe and responsible sale of alcohol.

The government will continue to work closely with the Liquor Control Board of Ontario (LCBO), the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) and The Beer Store, in addition to consulting and meeting with industry partners, local beverage alcohol producers and other stakeholders as it completes the launch of this new marketplace.

2024 Leak Detection Program - Water Services

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise the public that Watermark Solutions Limited will be completing a comprehensive Leak Detection Survey beginning September 9, 2024 and continuing until October 11, 2024.

The survey will pinpoint leaks on water transmission, distribution and service pipelines throughout the Town. The data collected will be used to assist the Town's Water Department in fixing watermain and service leaks to eliminate water loss. Residents are advised that there may be temporary lane restrictions while the work is being completed, however no significant impact to traffic is anticipated. For more information, please contact:

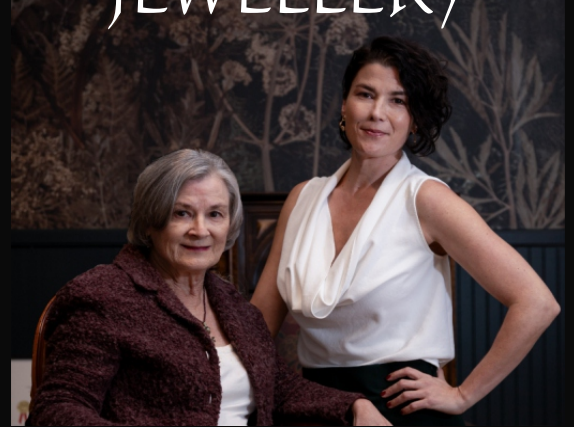

What is being proposed?

The Council of the Town of The Blue Mountains will be considering a new Draft Official Plan as part of the 5 year Official Plan review. The Town of The Blue Mountains Official Plan describes Town Council's policies on how land in the community should be used and helps to ensure that future planning and development will meet the needs of the community. An Official Plan deals with issues such as where housing, employment, agricultural, industrial and commercial uses should be located; what services such as roads, sewers and parks will be needed to support growth; and the way in which parts of the community will grow or be protected.

The Official Plan 5 year review was completed over two Phases. Phase 1 revisions were previously presented to Council through a similar Public Open House and Public Meeting process in 2022. Phase 2 is now complete and a Draft Official Plan that consolidates the work of Phase 1 and Phase 2 is available in Track Changes and a Clean Version for review and public comment.

The Town of The Blue Mountains is looking for public input on the proposed Draft Official Plan. The Public Open House is an opportunity to ask questions and have general discussions with the Town and its consultants on the proposed revisions. The Public Meeting is held in front of Council to receive your written and verbal comments on the planned changes.

Public Meeting Information

This Public Meeting will be held in-person and virtual (online) format. You are encouraged to provide your comments or questions in writing using email or regular letter mail to the Town Clerk in advance of the Public Meeting. All written comments are circulated to Council for their consideration. Comments

received by September 27th will be summarized and read by the Town Clerk at the Meeting.

Anyone wishing to speak on this matter at the Virtual Public Meeting is encouraged to pre-register early, and no later than September 24th at 9:00am. For those without a computer, a dial-in number is available.

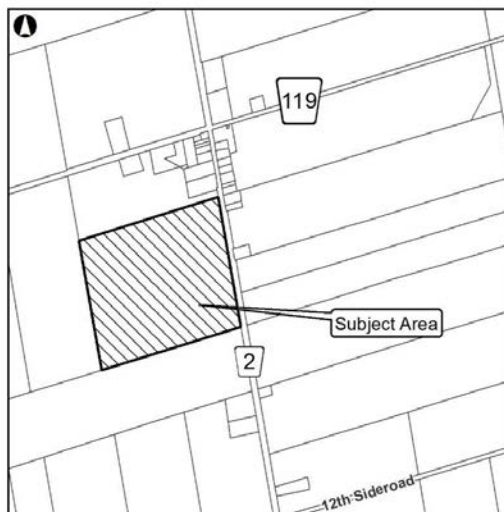

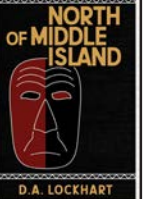

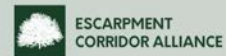
