Paramedic Services Week 2021

May 23 to 29 is Paramedic Services Week in Canada. The theme this year is Paramedic as Educator - Citizen Ready and it demonstrates the important roles that paramedics continue to play on the front lines of the healthcare system during the pandemic.

In Grey County, (122) paramedics are celebrating the idea that hard times don't last, but strong teams do. Over the past year, Grey County paramedics stepped up to learn, teach and perform a number of new roles in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. These include assisting in Long-Term Care homes, providing COVID testing and helping with COVID vaccine clinics, assisting with in-home palliative care, and helping other municipalities with patient transfers and other services.

"As the pandemic continues to affect us all, we're thankful for our paramedics and our frontline staff who are dedicated to saving lives," says Kevin McNab, Director of Paramedic Services. "I am so proud of our staff and the leadership and hard work they've demonstrated over the past year. More than half of our staff took on new duties, and the rest of our staff supported them by picking up work so we could all give extra where it was needed."

On Friday May 28, Grey County Paramedics will host a special Facebook Live ambulance tour at 3:30 p.m.


Accepted methods of payment include cash, debit or credit (Visa and Mastercard) and residents will be required to complete and sign a form upon the purchase of the season pass.

Town of the Blue Mountains Building Permit Submission Requirements

This is to advise that the permit submission requirements for the Town of the Blue Mountains are now to include the BCIN holder or Architect or Engineer, to stamp the Engineered Flooring layout(s) and Truss Layout to acknowledge that they have reviewed the documentation in coordination with the proposed permit drawings.

Please see the list below of all the information that is required in the submitted documents:

- Truss layout to be stamped by the BCIN holder/Engineer/Architect
- Engineered flooring layout to be stamped by the BCIN holder/Engineer/Architect
- Truss and flooring layouts are to note the size and type of any required hangers
- Truss and flooring layouts are to note bearing for any multi-ply flooring members and any 2-ply (and greater) girder trusses.

The requirement for these changes will take effect September 1st, 2021.

Individual truss details, stamped by a professional engineer, will continue to be accepted by the Building Department not less than 10 days prior to a framing inspection. The individual truss details are not required to be submitted at time of permit application.

Quick Facts

As of May 20, 2021, at 8:00 p.m., over 7.7 million vaccine doses have been administered across the province, with more than 93 per cent of Ontario residents aged 80 and over and more than 89 per cent of residents aged 70 to 79 having received at least one dose. More than 59 per cent of the population aged 18 and over have received at least one dose and more than 495,000 Ontarians are fully immunized, including 96 per cent of long-term care residents.

In May, Ontario expects to receive approximately 4.3 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines, including 254,500 doses of AstraZeneca. Approximately 4.7 million doses of the Pfizer vaccine are expected in June. Vaccine allocations for July have not been provided at this time.

On May 20 the government released its Roadmap to Reopen, outlining three steps to easing public health measures, including provincial vaccination targets. Based on current trends in key health indicators, including the provincial vaccination rate, the government expects to enter Step One of the Roadmap the week of June 14, 2021.

As of May 25, 2021, individuals will be able to log-in to the provincial portal through Ontario.ca to obtain a PDF copy of their COVID-19 Vaccination receipt for both their first and second dose.

The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) has recommended extending the vaccination dose interval up to four months for all Health Canada approved two-dose COVID-19 vaccines while maintaining a strong and sustained level of protection from the virus. Ontario has accepted and has followed NACI's recommendations as of March 10, 2021, with some limited exceptions.

Ontarians who are now eligible to book their vaccine appointment are asked to be patient, as it could take time to receive their vaccine. Public health units are responsible for managing and overseeing the distribution and administration of vaccines for their entire region, and public health units may have different vaccine administration rates based on local context.

New Organization To Increase Public Awareness Of Regions Black History

Recognizing the growing need to more inclusively celebrate the unique Black History in the area known as the northern terminus of the Underground Railroad, a new Grey County organization has been established. named the Grey County Black Heritage Society (GCBHS) The organization was recently incorporated by the Ontario Historical Society, as a result of the initiative of a small group of dedicated individuals, all well-known locally for their volunteering activities and community participation.

The creation of such a broadly focused, county-wide not-for-profit organization comes into existence just as public interest in Canada's Black History continues to escalate. The GCBHS organizers are of one accord in their belief that launching such a group could not be more timely, citing the growing awareness of Black Lives Matter and the recent unanimous passing of M36, a motion in the House of Commons (with no dissent), to recognize August 1st as Emancipation Day in Canada.

As part of their mandate the newly formed group plans to add its voice in support of the existing spring Black History Event and the annual launching of the Northern Terminus publication, both at Grey Roots Museum. Additional recognition will also be given to the vital work underway to ensure preservation of historic Black burial sites

in Owen Sound and Grey Highlands. In keeping with the decision to purposely employ a broad stroke approach in its celebration of local Black History, rather than be identified with a single event, the group anticipates future school programs honouring Black pioneers, and diverse Black cultural events including festivals, art exhibitions, and anti-racism workshops.






The Town of The Blue Mountains Schedule B Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for Drinking Water Storage and Pumping Capacity Deficiencies in West Pressure Zones 1, 2 and 3

The Town of The Blue Mountains is undertaking a Municipal Class EA to investigate opportunities to address the Town's Water Storage and Distribution System needs in the West Pressure Zones 1, 2 and 3.

Background: In November 2019, a Water Distribution System Master Plan was completed to evaluate the Town's long-term water distribution and storage needs. As part of the Master Plan, potential near and long-term storage and/or pumping deficiencies were identified in the Town's West Pressure Zones 1, 2, and 3. The purpose of this Schedule B Class EA is to evaluate and select the preferred water storage alternative(s) for these pressure zones.

Current Status: In Phase 2, the study evaluated a number of options to address the issues identified in Phase 1 based on environmental, social, technical, and financial criteria. Based on this evaluation, a preliminary preferred alternative has been identified, which consists of:

- Rehabilitation and recoating the Victora St. Elevated Tower (Immediate Need)
- Expanding the 10th Line Booster Pumping Station and constructing a transmission main and adding an in-ground reservoir at the 10th Line BPS



Public and agency consultation is a key element of the process and input is being sought on storage alternatives which may have an impact on stakeholders and property owners.

Public Consultation: A Virtual Public Open House (PIC 2) is being held to gather input from stakeholders on the preliminary preferred solution. All those interested in the project are invited to attend the Virtual Public Open House on:

The Corporation of the Town of Blue Mountains Transportation Master Plan

The Town of Blue Mountains (Town) is facing significant growth pressures and increased tourism activity alongside the broader South Georgian Bay region and will likely continue to see this growth into the foreseeable future. To strategically prepare for this continued growth and enhance our existing transportation network, the Town is undertaking the development of a comprehensive Transportation Master Plan (TMP).

The TMP will be an important resource for the Town as it continues to adapt to changing needs, growth and development, and new opportunities. The TMP will shape how we travel, help us further understand and define our regional connections, and support the movement of goods and services throughout the region. As part of the TMP study process, a vision will be established, actions and policies will be defined, and a financial strategy will be developed to address the short, medium, and long-term transportation needs of the community.

The Process

This study is being undertaken in accordance with Approach #1 of the Master Planning Process, as outlined in Appendix 4 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) As such, the TMP will generally address Phases 1 and 2 of the MCEA process and will form the basis for the recommended Schedule B and C transportation infrastructure projects identified within the TMP report.

Consultation

A comprehensive engagement process is being undertaken as part of the TMP process, and your participation is encouraged to ensure a thoughtful approach is taken to transportation planning. You are invited to visit the study webpage ([Transportation Master Plan | Your View The Blue Mountains](#)) to subscribe to receive updates on this study, to review relevant study information, and to participate in an upcoming online web map and survey to identify and comment on specific areas of interest or concern within the Town’s transportation network. Further updates will be provided when the online web map and survey are made available in early June 2021.

Additional opportunities will be offered to review information and provide your feedback as this study progresses. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic and associated physical distancing requirements, the format of these future public consultation events is not confirmed at this time.



Ontario Proceeding with Second Dose Administration of AstraZeneca

The Ontario government, in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health and other public health experts, is proceeding with second dose administration of the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, beginning with those who received their first dose of the vaccine between March 10 and March 19, 2021.

For a limited time during the week of May 24, individuals who received their first dose of AstraZeneca during the period of March 10, 2021 to March 19, 2021 may opt for an earlier dose interval of 10 weeks with informed consent. Choosing to receive the second dose of AstraZeneca at the 10-week interval is safe and provides strong protection against COVID-19. This opportunity is being made available to ensure every vaccine dose possible is used to protect Ontarians during the effective delivery period.

Eligible individuals are encouraged to contact the pharmacy or primary care provider where they received their first dose and can book an appointment beginning the week of May 24. This will begin in the regions where the AstraZeneca vaccine was initially launched in pharmacies in March 2021. Primary care settings and pharmacies may also be reaching out to eligible Ontarians.

On May 11, 2021, following the advice of Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. David Williams, the province paused the rollout and administration of first doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine. The decision was made out of an abundance of caution due to an observed increase in an adverse reaction, known as vaccine-induced immune thrombotic thrombocytopenia (VITT), linked to the AstraZeneca vaccine. Ontario is working closely with health experts to continuously review the data for the use of AstraZeneca for first doses. The decision to pause was also based on the increased and more reliable supply of the Pfizer and Moderna mRNA vaccines and the downward trend in cases.

Nearly one million Ontarians aged 40 and over received the AstraZeneca vaccine as their first dose between March 10, 2021 and May 11, 2021. Data from the UK strongly suggests a much-reduced risk of VITT in second doses of AstraZeneca – one in 600,000. Based on this evidence, the province is committed to ensuring Ontarians who received the AstraZeneca vaccine for their first dose, and who do not receive their second dose at the 10-week interval during the week of May 24, will have the ability to receive a second dose of AstraZeneca within the recommended interval of 12 weeks. The province is working with primary care providers and pharmacies to ensure second dose appointments are scheduled in advance of the 12-week interval, and will provide further information on how individuals who received their first dose of AstraZeneca can book a second dose appointment in the near future.

The province is also looking closely at available data and evidence from a clinical trial in the UK evaluating the administration of two doses of different vaccines and has requested direction from the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI). At this time, NACI does not recommend that vaccines of different types (e.g., mRNA vaccine and viral vector vaccine) be used in the two-dose series, as data on the immune response following mixed vaccine schedules are not yet available. Further information from clinical trials and NACI's recommendation are anticipated to be available in June 2021.

The province will provide further guidance with respect to administering doses of two different vaccines in the near future and in advance of the 12-week interval when most people are needing to receive their second dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine. When the time comes to receive a second dose, everyone who received a first dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine will receive either an AstraZeneca or mRNA vaccine for their second dose.

As more Ontarians receive a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, with over 7.7 million doses administered to date, providing the second dose of the vaccine will offer the best protection possible against COVID-19 and variants, and support provincial vaccination targets as part of Ontario's Roadmap to Reopen.

Development Proposal for Meaford

Grey County has received a plan of condominium application known as the Skydevco Condominium (County file number 42CDM-2021-02). The overall development, not all of which will be a part of the vacant land plan of condominium, proposes to create a 90-unit hotel, 14 two-storey townhouse units, 72 waterfront townhouse units, and 120 apartment units (proposed as rental tenure) for a site-wide total of 206 residential units. A zoning by-law amendment application has also been submitted to the Municipality of Meaford for this proposed development.

The subject lands are designated as 'Special Policy Area 1' in the Municipality of Meaford Official Plan. This Special

Policy Area envisioned development which would be "a suitable mix of residential, open space and commercial uses related primarily to the hospitality, tourism and service sectors." A rezoning application has also been submitted to the Municipality of Meaford and will be processed simultaneously with the condominium. Site plan and standard condominium plans are to be submitted at a late date.

A more thorough analysis of the County and Meaford Official Plan policies will follow the agency review and the public process.


